

## GUIDANCE TO HELP YOU GROW

The online Master of Education in Clinical Mental Health Counseling from Oklahoma City University is the first step toward a fulfilling career as a licensed professional counselor.

Earn a master's in counseling that emphasizes the practitioner-wellness model. Throughout the program, counseling is viewed as an integration of art and science. Students will learn from a faculty of doctorally prepared experts, including currently practicing counselors who are committed to mentorship that supports students' professional and personal development.

- Comprehensive curriculum that meets core course requirements for prospective licensed professional counselor (LPC) applicants
- Flexible, asynchronous, online delivery
- Small, engaged, collaborative cohorts
- Interactive skills labs in preparation for fieldwork
- Stipends for attending conferences and presentation opportunities

### Admissions Requirements

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university recognized by the U.S. Department of Education (or its foreign equivalent recognized by the country in which the degree is granted)
- 3.0 undergraduate cumulative GPA
  - *Students may be admitted on probation, at the discretion of the program director, with a cumulative GPA of 2.75-2.99*
- Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions
- 2 letters of recommendation
  - *If the bachelor's degree is more than five years old, a significant sample of former scholarship may be submitted in lieu of an instructor's letter. In this case, the single letter of recommendation can be from a supervisory person of employment*
- A personality/disposition deemed suitable for the helping and crisis intervention disciplines
- An interview may be requested of all applicants who reach the final stage of admissions review
- ESL Students
  - *Required: TOEFL internet-based test (iBT) score of 79 or higher, an overall IELTS score of 6.5 with, at least, a 6.0 on each sub-band*

### Advance Your Career While You Work

- 60 credit hours
  - *Core curriculum designed to prepare students for licensure*
  - *Practicum and internship experiences included*
- Complete in as few as 2 years with full-time enrollment
  - *3 years with blended full-time/part-time enrollment*
  - *4 years with part-time enrollment*
- No GRE, no waitlist
- Three starts annually: fall, spring, summer

With no GRE requirement, no waitlist and competitive tuition rates, you can earn your Master of Education in Clinical Mental Health Counseling at a respected university without hassle or exorbitant costs.

Once you complete your degree, you'll have completed the academic requirements for becoming a licensed counselor. However, to become an LPC you'll also need to complete postgraduate "supervised experience" hours and pass the exam required by your state board of licensure. Some states may also require passing a jurisprudence examination or completing additional training before you officially apply for licensure.
